

## 2. How to use this workbook



Some questions will ask you to **reflect on what you've seen**, while others will get you thinking about your own skills and which animal care role might suit you in the future.

## What is a job description?

A **job description** is a short document that explains what a job is all about. It tells people:

- 1. What the job is called
- 2. What kind of work they'll be doing
- 3. What kind of person would be good at the job

It helps employers find the right person and helps people know if the job is right for them.

## 6. Working as a Team





## Prep for the day

It's time to prepare the practice! Ensure supplies are ready for surgeries and check-ups. Use the checklist to organise:

1. Check vaccine stocks.

- Syringes 20 ready
- Bandages Full stock
- Cleaning supplies For messes
- 2.Review the schedule and assign tasks. Add items slowly and confirm!
- 3. Coordinate with the team for any surprise tasks.

## 9. Reflection Activity - Your Turn: Which Role is Right for You?



Now that you've explored what each person does at Rackheath Vets, it's time to think about **which job would suit you best**.

Activity: Reflect on Your Role Look back at the job description you wrote earlier. Think about your own skills, interests, and personality. Then answer these questions: Which role do you think you would enjoy the most?
Why do you think you'd be good at it?
What qualities or experiences do you have that would help you?
Write a short paragraph explaining your choice. You might start like this: "I think I would be a good Veterinary Nurse because I am caring and calm. I've looked after my neighbour's dog before and I like helping others."

## 10. Role Play



## **Job Interview Role Play**

In pairs or small groups, take turns pretending you're at a **job interview** at Rackheath Vets!

- •One person is the interviewer.
- •The other is applying for their chosen role.

Ask and answer questions like:

"Why do you want to work here?"

"What skills do you have that suit this job?"

"Can you give an example of when you worked well in a team?"

Swap roles and try different jobs if you'd like!

This activity helps you think about your strengths and how they match the jobs in animal care and gives you a taste of a real interview!

**Caring** – Showing kindness, calmness, and compassion to animals and their owners.



**Teamwork** – Working together so every animal gets the best care.




**Observation** – Noticing small changes in animals' behaviour or health.


